Zonta International Foundation Report

I have now received the Jan. 31st report from ZIF and wanted to give you a brief synopsis of where we are in District 1:

We are now one of 9 districts with 100% of our clubs donating - but remember we got there first and held the distinction of being the only district at that level for several months!

We are still holding at 41% of our members making individual donations - an amazing increase over at least the last several biennia and a demonstration of outstanding commitment by our members. And the 41% places us second among all districts in the total percentage of individual contributions! Hats off to each and every contributor.

As a district we have donated to date (1/31/14) a total (club plus individual contributions) of \$ 44,626.30 USD. The \$50,000 mark is achieveable considering we have 3 months remaining in the biennium and several spring club fundraisers in that timeframe. I encourage you to speak to your Boards and your members and see what we can do to make one final push to support OUR Foundation. But keep in mind that your club and its members have until APRIL 30, 2014 to make any additional donations to be recognized in the Foundation's publicized Annual Report. However, you have until MAY 31st to make any additional contributions to be counted in this current biennium total. (The report need to go to press in time for the 2014 Convention and hence the difference in dates.) May 31st is the absolute deadline for any monies to be counted in this biennium's club and district efforts - and that is a "received by" date: checks must be in the Foundation office by 5/31. All monies received after that date will be counted toward the next biennium – 2014-16.

Finally the Foundation is now at 71% of it's biennium fundraising goal of \$4.9 million, having now raised \$3,514,013! Historicaly, I think there is always a last minute rush of donations as the biennium closes, so I think we may make it. But everyone needs to do their part and every little bit counts. Last month I sent you all individual emails regarding your club's status with total donations to date, number of members making individual donations and your club total contribution. If you have any questions or concerns do not hesitate to email me. And as always my sincere appreciation to you and your membership for their outstanding support thus far!
