## April 14, 2014 Zonta of Quaboag Valley Dinner Meeting

Ludlow Country Club, Ludlow, MA

Co-President Ann Cormier called the meeting to order at 6:40

The meeting opened with Donna Covino of the Carson Center speaking as a representative on its behalf. The Center is one of the recipients of this year's 'Silent No More' Auction. She thanked the Club for this honor. The Center serves Ware, Palmer, and Monson. QV Zonta's donation will enable the expansion of services to Belchertown and Brookfield. The Hilltowns, Wales, and Hartwick are supported with a small grant. Donna offered information on the Center's history, organizational structure, process, and purpose—to provide behavioral health and rehabilitation services, as well as safe havens, and family service for both adults and children in communities throughout western Massachusetts.

The Ware Domestic Violence Civilian Police advocate works with the Center to provide it community referrals, as well as reports of violence from the police logs. Interestingly, the logs are frequently missing phone numbers since the victim is not ready to accept services. Two shelters have closed.

Donna explained that the Center is organized with representatives from various fields, such as nursing, religion, and education. Donna supervises the clinicians. At this point, there are two who take referrals, two regulators, and two who handle the phone calls. Often times the court will call a counseling agency which contacts the Carson Center. One huge service is providing advocacy by coaching, driving, and supporting a client in court. The 'safe plan' advocate creates safety planning for both children and adults. A new program which is currently being certified is 'Batterers' Prevention.' Most participants are batterers. Police are involved in this program. Therapists are trained to handle violent situations.

The Center also deals with little-thought-about issues. For example, rural towns often want power control over the financial expenditures. Another problem is that of transportation for those being treated. Three groups do have transportation-one in Palmer and two in Ware (one specifically for young mothers). Furthermore, sadly battered victims take on the average of seven incidents before they leave their home.



#### Installation of New Members:

Ann Cormier introduced Denise Deshane, District 1 Governor from Maine. She attended the meeting for the honor of installing two new Zonta QV club members, Dana Burton and Sandy Goss. Denise reviewed the meaning of 'Zonta' which is a Lakota Indian word for 'honest and trustworthy.' She also read the membership pledge. Following the presentation of yellow roses and Zonta pins to Dana and Sandy.

Denise gave the club an update.

- She shared with the members that Zonta had received UNI-CEF publicity from the U.N. regarding 'Every Child.'
- Also, each club has until May 31st to donate toward Zonta International's \$4.9 million fundraising goal.
- The Biennial convention, to be held in Orlando, Florida occurs from 6/26-7/1. Early Bird prices are available until 5/18.
- Fall Conference will be held in Springfield from 10/24-10/26

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

Carolyn Braskie submitted the Secretary's minutes which were approved as written.

Pam Albertson presented the Annual Budget and reviewed changes with the club. It will be voted on during the June meeting. Dues money should be sent to Pam ASAP.

## **NEW BUSINESS / COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

**Golf Tournament Report:** Debbie Wood reviewed various details/past statistics of the fall golf tournament. Last year seventy two people participated. Can that number beaten? Marge will be accepting money for players. She has distributed forms for sponsors. While she has collected a respectable amount of

I am pleased to announce that as the biennium winds down and the March ZIF report is in, four of our District 1 Clubs have achieved the distinction of having 100% of their members make at least one donation to the Zonta International Foundation during the current 2012-14 biennium! Congratulations go out to: Arlington, Lakes Region, Quaboag Valley and Quinebaug Valley

Collectively the membership of these four clubs have given individual donations of close to \$6,500 USD! Last biennium we had one club - Quaboag - achieve this 100% distinction, and it was the first time in anyone's recent recollection that any District 1 club had accomplished this goal. Now they are joined by three other clubs. This has been a banner year for our district in the support of OUR Foundation. To date the total of both club and individual donations over the past two years is \$46,256.80 USD!

Please remember that in order to be honored at convention for goals such as the 100% member distinction, members and clubs have until just April 30th to submit donations. They must be received by that date, and therefore any further donations should be made online to ensure the deadline is met. However, you still have until May 31st to donate for this biennium and those donations will receive credit in the 2013-14 Annual Report. Again that is a "received by' date, so either make the contribution in early May by mail or online. Once again we encourage any club with a spring fundraising event to make a final contribution and help us raise the final District total to as close to \$50,000 as we can - which would be an all time record for us. With the a week in April and most of May left, it is within reach!

A heartfelt thank you to everyone who has made out achievement thus far possible. Hats off to the club presidents who made the 100% attainment a goal and a reality. Each of the four clubs had movers and shakers who worked hard to make this happen and we so much appreciate their commitment and hard work! the clubs will be honored at both the ZI Convention in Orlando and at Fall Conference next October.
