Meeting Called to Order at 6 P.M. by Co President Kris Goold. Kris offered a moment of silence after she recalled Joanne Lambert's many accomplishments while a member of Zonta.

Secretary's Minutes: Read and approved as published in the Newsletter.

Treasurer's Report: Pam reported no activity in the month of February. She indicated that annual notices regarding our dues will be sent to members and dues should be submitted to Pam by May 1st. They remain \$124. Pam is in the process of preparing an Annual Budget for 2015-2016 for the membership to review after the Board reviews and approves it at the April Board Meeting.

Old Business:

- Mary Ann is in New York and informed Kris that Zontians might appear on March 12th on the taping of the Today Show in NY.
 They will be wearing Zonta colors.
- Kris mentioned that the Board learned that Gayle Dragicevich
 has informed Pam that she is unable to commit to joining our
 club at this time. When she was contacted regarding a refund
 of the \$62.00 she had provided she did not want it returned.
 The Board voted to send it to the Rose Fund in her name and
 will inform her of the plan. Gayle hopes to attend our May Auction and reconsider joining in the future.
- Kris had prepaid for a ticket to the Women's Comedy Night scheduled for the Log Cabin on March 26th. She is unable to attend and offered her ticket to any member. Debbie and Pam are already planning to attend. Debbie will hold the ticket for anyone interested to contact as Kris is leaving tomorrow for Florida.

Kris led the Zonta Blessing before dinner was served.

Advocacy Presentation: Tina delivered a nice definition of advocacy as a means of preventing gender discrimination, basic human rights, gender prejudices, improving the political status of women and advocating for more representation in government. In addition advocacy can help towards women receiving better benefits, equal access to salaries and other privileges afforded men. Tina listed the many ways our club advocates for women citing the support we provide the Soldier On Veterans and our efforts at fundraising so we can provide funding for programs that serve women and all the social media we access to spread the word. Tina described the many Zonta International Service Projects that benefit women in different

countries. She reviewed how our advocacy efforts need to follow basic steps such

- 1.) Actively seeking opportunities to advocate for women,
- 2.) Asking questions about our strengths in helping women and
- 3.) Educating others about solutions to enact and implement programs that benefit women.

The ZISVAW program under ZI and the" Zonta Says No" campaign are good examples of advocacy efforts. Tina's presentation was very enlightening and assures our club undertakes a valuable role in advocacy efforts for women.

 Kris informed members that guidelines for the Sunshine Fund were discussed, reviewed and agreed upon by the Board for all bereavement and illness affecting our club members. Basically \$50 would be sent to the fund mentioned in an obituary or \$50 to the ZI Rose Fund or to another purpose depending on the circumstances.

Committee Reports

Scholarship Committee: Dana has two applications for the YWPA with a deadline of March 14th. Jane M. Klausman applications were mailed to 13 area colleges with a May 29th due date. Dana will meet with members of her committee.

Service Committee: Loretta distributed and reviewed the Service Committee Request For Funds Form as prepared by the committee and approved by the Board. Loretta will assure it is posted on our website in a format that can be completed on line. She presented 2 proposals which reviewed and approved by membership.

- 1) An additional \$50 towards the \$100 already allocated as a recurring expense for the Top Floor Learning Annual May basket with a golf theme.
- 2) A proposal of \$150 for Christina's House towards essential operational supplies. Kris had raised her concern at a Board meeting that Christina's House is sectarian but in its reference to being "faith based" and with a mission similar to Zonta's mission, Kris withdrew her objection and the approval for \$150 was voted and approved by the members.

Auction Committee: Trish presented that the date is Monday, May 4th at the Ludlow Country Club. The menu and the price (\$30) are the same as last year. As in the past, 1/3 of the funds go to ZI, 1/3 to the Soldier On program for women. Marge presented that she hoped that the Palmer Domestic Violence Task Force could be provided the last 1/3 of the auction income. Besides their White Ribbon campaign in

We learned a little more about the women and the proposed new residence where some of them hope to move this summer. The ladies were excited to describe the guad apartments which 4 women will share. They will have a common kitchen and living room, two bathrooms and private rooms with built in beds. The ladies hope they can occupy the dwellings in August. They were excited about some of the furnishings they would like to make it their home. Linens and decorative wall plaques with inspirational and motivational words were amongst the items they would appreciate. Dana and I explored their possible interest in taking them shopping for the items at Target, Christmas



Tree Shop, etc. and they were very receptive. Dana inquired about their interest in acupuncture and an offer of the use of a Reiki table at the cottage was extended. Dana will be contacting the Wellness Director to propose a date in April. During this visit a former resident of the cottage stopped by and mentioned her interest in some type of transitional group or service for women who leave the program but want ongoing support.

Marge and Joanne joined me for the second Saturday when Sandy provided manicures for 3 women. They described many activities they have enjoyed and would like their Zonta "sisters" to join them for fun and socialization. Game play, camping, shopping for the new residence were amongst the activities they suggested. They are enthusiastic about attending our May 4th "Silent No More Auction." Ginger offered to speak on behalf of the Soldier On program and they all will consider some items they might want to donate to the auction understanding that 1/3 of the income will benefit Soldier On. The women enjoyed the refreshments and manicures. They took the remaining food to share with the women who were unable to attend the manicures. I know that I am joined by all our club members in expressing my appreciation for Sandy's generous donation of her time for the ladies to be pampered for a few hours. Dana, Joanne, Marge, Sandy and I gained a little more insight regarding the hopes and dreams of the special women in the Soldier On Program reinforcing the valuable service and friendship we offer them.

While not official Zonta events, the upcoming Commission on the Status of Women and the North American Inter-District Meeting will bring Zontians from around the world together in a unique format.

The Commission on the Status of Women (CSW) Primary theme: Beijing +20 March 9-20, 2015 New York City

An unprecedented 55 Zontians from North America, Europe, Africa, Asia, and Australia will join thousands of other members of NGOs around the world as the Commission reviews the progress made by Member States since the Fourth World Conference on Women in September 1995 in Beijing. In 2013, the Member States adopted a resolution calling for a 20-year review of the Beijing Platform for Action to take place in 2015 at this session of the CSW. The focus will be on the 12 critical areas of concern as outlined in 1995. (See sidebar)

In addition to official meetings at the United Nations, side events inside the UN and NGO parallel events at locations around Manhattan will occur. As an NGO, Zonta is allocated 20 passes for members to attend sessions in the UN. Parallel events are open to everyone. Most are free. This year, all attendees must register with the CSW.

Meeting and engaging with women, men, and teens (female and male) from around the world working to advance the status of women in their own

unique ways is an amazing experience. This year, I will attend my third CSW. Each one has been an eye opening and thought provoking opportunity.

In addition to participating in discussions at the UN, Zonta will also host parallel events during the two weeks. On March 12, The Zonta Club of New York will host a dinner for ZI President Maria Jose Landiera Ostergaard and the Zonta delegation, which will include a discussion on the Beijing Platform for Action.
