Supporting Women in the Judicial System



Two speakers will join us at the October meeting to inform us about programs supporting women in unfortunate circumstances.

Phyllis (Phyl) Grondalski—Volunteer at Western Massachusetts Regional Women's Correctional Center in Chicopee, MA .

Phyl has been volunteering for nearly 25 years through the Hampden County Sherriff's Department. Since 1992 she has been taking part in the **Mother-Child Program** which gives incarcerated mothers a chance to spend time

with their children—playing, talking and holding each other. Children get dropped off by their current caretaker(s) every Saturday and Phyl is there to greet them in a 'grandmotherly fashion' and keep them company while awaiting the visit with their mother. On any given Saturday she will carry babies and toddlers to the visiting room; mentor the Family Service Counselor and volunteers; support the women's Correctional Center Family Services with growing the Mother-Child Visitation Program; or support the mothers in interacting with and parenting the children. Honoring her recently for her service, Sheriff Michael J. Ashe noted, "Phyllis is right at the heart of what drives this department in her belief that every person is worth placing faith in and worth caring about."

Regina Sanderson—Probation Officer and leader of the Womanhood Program at the Eastern Hampshire District Court

The **Womanhood Program** started out of a need: the number of women entering the court system has increased significantly over the last couple years. Regina brought the program to western Massachusetts, after seeing the success of a similar initiative in Chelsea. She explains, "The program that we provide serves to educate them, and we're hoping by education to empower them to then go on obtain future successes." The multi-week program for female probationers is designed to prevent recidivism and help women offenders achieve healthy lives, free of violence, drugs, and crime. Probationers in these programs attend classes that address domestic violence, women's health, substance abuse, and job readiness skills. The Womanhood Program at the Eastern Hampshire District Court held its first graduation ceremony in 2015 and hopes to continue and grow this effort.

Installation of Officers: Marge Cavanaugh installed the officers of the club: Directors, Liz Reeves, Ann Cormier and Joanne Turner-Chiacchia, Secretary Debbie Wood, Treasurer, Pam Albertson and Tina Guinasso as Vice President and Lisa Sedelow as President. She presented the new officers not previously installed with flowers and Lisa received the gavel.

President Lisa Sedelow called the meeting to order at 6:10 P.M.

Jane M. Klausman Award: As Chairman of the Scholarship Committee Dana Burton presented Elizabeth Fitzgerald with the Jane M. Klausman business award. Elizabeth informed us of the internship which led her to mentor Melyssa Brown and a position at Meyers Brothers Kalicka CPA firm. She continues to work on her Masters Degree in business while her husband pursues a Master's Degree. They are raising 5 daughters while also dealing with her mother who has a terminal cancer condition. Elizabeth is certainly a well deserving recipient of the award and expressed her gratitude for the financial support that the JMK scholarship affords her.

Minutes of the June 8 Meeting: Read and approved as written in the newsletter

Treasurer's Report: Approved and filed for audit.

District Finance Committee: Joanne reported that it has been a challenging year to balance the budget for our District as the membership has been dwindling. District 1 has set a goal of 25 new members in the next year to avoid the risk of losing our charter or merging with another district. Elizabeth Fitzgerald suggested that contact could be made on college campuses to improve our visibility and membership efforts.

Service Committee: Debbie mentioned 3 requests we have received. 1.) The first is for \$200 to purchase 10 books "It is Just a House" for donation to local libraries. A motion was made and seconded to spend \$400 for the purchase of 20 books. Mary Ann will contact the author to obtain signed copies and coordinate the purchase with the Links for Libraries program for distribution. 2.) Woman-Hood Program: We are expecting Regina Sanderson from the Probation Department to attend our October meeting to provide more information so that we can determine how the club will participate in the request 3.) The Soldier On program is requesting assistance for furnishings for the new residence under construction in Leeds. Debbie

will follow up to gather more information in regards to our level of participation in the project.

Golf Tournament Committee: Debbie reported that we had 62 players and ample gift cards and prizes. The introduction of the string advantage added a different element to the event. The final total of profit will be determined soon but we earned between \$3000 and \$4000. Great team effort!

Poinsettia Committee: Liz suggested that we try to use social media to help with this fundraiser and increase our visibility. We will start taking orders next month.

October 23-25th Fall District Conference in Burlington, VT: There are approximately 7 members planning to attend. Joanne offered to serve as Delegate with Ann as the Alternate. Help with credentialing may be needed. Marge, Mary and Debbie offered their help. We will sell T-shirts in the Zonta Store and prepare a "Date Night" basket for the District Silent Auction. Candy, blanket, movie tickets, wine, etc. are welcome. We invite members to bring the items to the October meeting including a large basket. Lisa will bring cellophane, ribbon, tape and tools to assemble the basket.

Founders' Day: After discussing possible nominees, it was decided by the group to select Mary Reardon, Director of the YWCA for this honor. Dianne will contact Mary to determine if she can attend the November event. BJ, Lisa, Dianne and Ann offered to serve on the Founder's Day Committee.

October 12, 2015 Dinner Meeting: Phyllis Grondalski, longest serving volunteer for the Mother-Child Visitation Program at Western Mass Regional Women's Correctional Center will attend and inform us about her experience and the program. Regina Sanderson, Probation Officer will also attend to tell us more about the WomanHood program to help us determine our level of participation.


