

Our **Silent "no more! Auction** event is held annually to raise awareness and funds for projects aimed at empowering and improving the lives of women and children. Beneficiaries include Zonta International Foundation, Soldier On Women Vet-

erans and a local organization chosen each year by members. Proposals for the 2019 recipient are noted below.

- 1. From Daniele: Gándara Esperanza Women's Transitional Support Services (TSS) a short-term residential program for women who need further stabilization and intensive case management after detox or for women that may be coming from a public shelter that were recently in detox or a higher level care. The women come in to this program with very little. I have learned they thrive on things such as movies, journals, colored pencils, candy, coffee, games, adult coloring books, nail polish, makeup, lotions, hair products. The TSS program and the staff are amazing. I witness these counselors and directors go above and beyond to help make these women's journey a success. With working so closely and witnessing this amazing program, I feel any extra donation the program could use to provide the items so needed to make their days more comfortable would be so greatly appreciated.
- 2. From the Centennial Committee: "Strong Women and Girls Read" As we celebrate 100 years of empowering women and girls, the club's Centennial Committee would like to recommend partnering with four local libraries to stock up on great books featuring some of the most awesome and inspiring female characters ever created. Head librarians at Monson, Palmer, Ludlow and Belchertown have provided us with an incredible list of books for youth, young adults and adults that they would obtain in honor of Zonta's 100th birthday each would include a tribute bookplate to Zonta and the Quaboag Valley Club and feature in their individual libraries. While the libraries do purchase books with women role models, they are unable to do so on this scale. This is an opportunity to broaden our outreach in our local communities and highlight women and girls who refused to stay silent. Representatives from each library would be invited to the Auction and talk about this project.

The meeting was called to order at 6:18 pm by President Trish Pupek.

Business Meeting

Minutes: The January meeting minutes were reviewed and accepted.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> February financial report was sent to membership via email. This report was reviewed and filed for audit. Joanne circulated the club roster and asked members to confirm their contact information. She also reminded members that membership dues are due by May 1st. Joanne will send the invoices in the coming weeks.

<u>Service</u>: Deb reported that puzzles and coloring books will be delivered to the Women Soldier On. Also Deb asks that members continue to donate puzzles, adult color books, journals, and coloring pencils. These donations will be distributed to the Women's Correctional Facilities.

<u>Scholarship</u>: Trish reported Young Women in Public Affairs (YWPA) Scholarship applications will close March 15th. No applicants at the time of the meeting.

<u>Centennial Committee</u>: Trish and Marge reported that the Centennial Committee met on March 5th. The committee decided that one hundred books on topics of women, women's issues and empowerment be donated to the following libraries: Ludlow, Palmer, Belchertown and Monson These libraries will provide each a list of twenty five books and prices. Maria informed the group that each library has a "Friends of the Library" group and, perhaps, the Centennial committee can seek some funding from these groups for the desired books.

<u>Silent no more Auction</u>: Trish reported that our club's 11th annual silent auction will be held on the first Monday of May, 5/6. Members are asked to solicit donations of auction items. Tickets for the auction will be available at our April meeting. The cost will remain the same. The group discussed the need to select a third recipient of the auction proceeds. Marge raised the issue of having our own club be the recipient. Trish explained that this is not in line with our guidelines. Danielle and Shanique recommended Gandara TSS program or DV Shelter. Pam suggested the Womanhood Program. Both Danielle and Pam will write up a brief summary on both these organizations and their mission. Trish will email this information to our club members for an email vote.

Other Business

<u>Period Project</u>: Joanne reported that monetary donations for the Period Project are still trickling in and will be ear marked for next year's Period Project.

Announcements: Our next meeting will be April 8th at the Ludlow Country Club.
