The Status of Women and Girls

Donna Haghighat, CEO of Women's Fund of Western Massachusetts will be our guest speaker on March 9, 2020. She will share a report on the status of women and girls in Western MA

Donna Haghighat came to the Women's Fund with over 12 years of experience developing programs, cultivating relationships, launching startups, fundraising, directing communications strategy, creating strategic plans and building advocacy programs. Under her leadership, the Women's Fund has successfully launched The Young Women's Initiative for girls and young women of color in Springfield and forged a partnership with University of Massachusetts Amherst where participants in the LIPPI leadership program receive 500 level academic credit. Prior to joining the Women's Fund, Haghighat was Principal at Collabyrinth Collective, LLC. Previous roles have included Executive Director of the Aurora Women & Girl's Foundation, Chief Engagement and Advocacy Officer for YWCA Hartford Region, a strategic consultant, Chief Development Officer for Hartford Public Library, Interim Director and Grants/Program Manager of the Women's Education and Leadership Fund, and Co-President of AAUW CT.



Haghighat was awarded the Trinity College Alumni Medal of Excellence in 2019, was the grand prize winner of the 2012 University of Hartford's Barney School of Business International Business Plan Competition and was recognized as The Trinity Club of Hartford's Person of the Year in 1999 and the Trinity College National Alumni Association Award in 1996.

For the last 10 years, Zonta has donated a Golf Basket to **Top Floor Learning at the Palmer Library** for their annual raffle.

The Club allocates \$150 towards the contents. Each basket should contain at least \$300 worth of goods. We make up the difference by donations from members. If you do not have golf–related items, I will shop for you using your cash donation.

ENDING CHILD MARRIAGE -

Annual Report Summary Pam Albertson

Child marriage marks the end of childhood for many girls. Instead of playing or studying, child brides are significantly more likely to be the victims of domestic violence, to contract HIV/AIDS, and to die due to complications during pregnancy and childbirth. They are unable to make decisions for themselves.

Driving child marriage are factors such as poverty, a culture of gender inequality, customary or religious laws that condone the practice, and a lack of legal protections for the girls. In response UNICEF and the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) came together in 2016 to establish the Global Programme to Accelerate Action to End Child Marriage. The Global Programme works in 12 countries – Bangladesh, Burkina Faso,

Ethiopia, Ghana, India, Mozambique, Nepal, Niger, Sierra Leone, Uganda, Yemen, and Zambia – where it brings together governments, civil society, families, and young people in a collective effort to prevent girls from marrying too young and support those already married as girls. Since it was launched in 2016, the Global Programme has reached almost five million adolescent girls.


The Global Programme achieved the following results in 2018:

- Nearly 3 million adolescent girls were empowered through life skills education and training, far exceeding the year's goal of 1.4 million.
- 77 percent of girls enrolled in these programs transitioned from primary to lower secondary school, compared to just 59.8 percent who made the same transition in 2017.
- Direct support for education programs provided assistance to over 6,000 schools to help them improve the quality of girls' education.
- Community members, headmasters, and parents were educated about the lasting benefits of girls' education. Last year, 1.73 million individuals regularly participated in community dialogues organized by the Global Programme to address these topics.
- Media campaigns promoting gender equitable norms including ending child marriage reached an estimated 10.8 million people.
- Over 41 percent of individuals who participated in household surveys demonstrated positive attitudes and behavior toward investing in and supporting adolescent girls, compared to just 25 percent who expressed those views in 2017.
- Progress has been made. Eleven governments have developed national action plans to end child marriage, nine countries have costed plans, and six countries have allocated budgets for the implementation of the plans. In addition, several countries have repealed preexisting policies that discriminated against married and pregnant girls, especially in respect to their continued access to education.

Yes, child marriages are declining. The overall proportion of women who were married as children decreased by 15 percent in the last decade, from 1 in 4 to approximately 1 in 5. Yet despite this success, challenges remain. The current rate of decline is not sufficient to meet the SDG target of ending child marriage by 2030; instead of 10 years, it would take **50** years to achieve. Continued investment is critical for enabling the Global Programme to keep scaling up its programs to end child marriage.


Zonta is the first private sector partner to join this effort. Zonta's name and logo are recognized on all public documents issued by the Global Programme. Zonta is also prominently featured on UNICEF's website and publications.

Together, they destroyed train lines, ambushed Nazis, plotted prison breaks, and gathered crucial intelligence—laying the groundwork for the D-Day invasion that proved to be the turning point in the war.


