Meeting called to order 6:05 by Area Director Mary Knight (Trish running late)

Welcome Jena Marie Roseman, YWPA award recipient Dana hand delivered a check, certificate and yellow rose in advance of the meeting. Jena shared her plans for college and her passions. She greatly appreciates this honor. Best of luck Jena – keep us informed!

Minutes: A motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes published in the Bog as written. Thank you to Liz for taking on this role after Shanique was unable to continue.

Treasurers Report: A motion was made and voted to file the report for audit. Joanne reminded us that this service donations for 2020-21 will not be impacted by the Pandemic – we have a fund balance of \$11,415, with most of that earmarked. However, the ability to have a golf tournament and deliver poinsettias this fall will impact our service expenditures for 2021-22. Thank you, Joanne for four years of dedicated support in keeping our ‘books’ straight! Joanne will work with Andrea to transition responsibilities and mentor as needed.

International Convention 2020 – Suz has generously stepped in as our delegate for convention, as Maria was not eligible because of the timing of her membership. She will get training on the online voting procedure later this month, but explained that her role will be to review materials and vote on the following:

**Registration and raffles will be held outdoors and masks are required.** We will have gloves and sanitizer on hand. No breakfast items or snacks will be handed out, but the club's food truck will circulate during play with snacks and non-alcoholic beverages for sale. Box lunches will be handed out after play.

We need the help of all members for the following:

1.) **WE NEED PLAYERS!!!** Please assure that all registrations are submitted with payment. We made it easy to register on line this year. If there are incomplete teams we can make assignments. Please see attached Registration form in this newsletter and online at [zontaqv.org/golf](http://zontaqv.org/golf). Post and share with as many people as possible.

2.) **WE NEED PRIZES** including gift cards, all denominations and appropriate for men and women. I imagine some of you may have suitable items you saved for the auction which you can donate. Some combinations of items with gift card for \$40 to \$50 value are appreciated. We plan to compile a list with a description of value much like we do for the auction so please

send that list to me. If you have any doubts take and send a picture. It is important that we receive the items prior to the tournament. (Set up will start at 7am.) 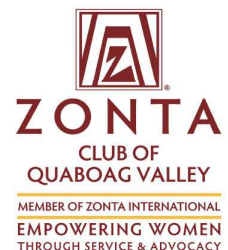
