January we are going to celebrate Amelia Earhart



Amelia Earhart month—Celebrating Women Redefining What's Possible: Jessica Sexauer

Jessica Sexauer grew up in a military family, moving every two to three years due to her father's job as an Army Aviator. Throughout her childhood, Jess had the opportunity to live in Germany and Thailand as well as four US states, including Massachusetts.

With a desire to also serve her country, Jess attended the United States Military Academy at West Point, New York. While there, Jess studied Mathematics and was the captain of the women's Rugby team. She graduated and commissioned as an Army Officer in 2012 and began flight school at Fort Rucker, Alabama where she selected to fly the AH-64 Apache Attack Helicopter.

In 2015 while stationed at Fort Carson, Colorado, Jess deployed to Kandahar, Afghanistan for a nine month combat deployment as a Platoon Leader. Following deployment, Jess was stationed at Fort Wainwright, Alaska where she served for 28 months as a Company Commander. During this time, she went on a nine month rotational deployment in South Korea.

Jess is currently training to be an Instructor Pilot back at Fort Rucker, Alabama, where she lives with her spouse, Alex and three pets, Emmett, Abbie and Ellie.

Amelia Earhart spent much of her career speaking and writing to promote women's opportunities in aviation and other fields. She hoped that one day men and women would be valued for their individual abilities. "It has always seemed to me," she wrote "that boys and girls are educated very differently ... too often little attention is paid to individual talent. Instead, education goes on dividing people according to their sex, and putting them in little feminine or masculine pigeonholes."

"Some of us have great runways already built for us. If you have one, take off! But if you don't have one, realize it is your responsibility to grab a shovel and build one for yourself and for those who will follow after you."

President Dana Burton welcomed everyone and began the evening with Announcements:

- Congratulations to Karen and Chris have been voted members of the Zonta Club of Quaboag Valley. They will be inducted at our January meeting. We are confident that they will be assets to our cl.ub, and we hope to offer them leadership opportunities – a win-win.
- The Every Member Every November Challenge exceeded expectations. Thank you to all members who contributed and a "well done" to the Chairman of the Zonta International Development Committee, Mary Ann Rubis, for a well-run campaign. With our help, more than US\$450,000 was raised to support Zonta's international service projects. Every dollar donated will provide lifechanging opportunities for women and girls around the world.
- Sincere thanks to all members who donated gift cards in lieu of this year's toys for children in shelters during the holidays. Over \$300 worth were given to EACH the YWCA and Palmer DV Task Force for distribution.
- Kudos to those who contributed to Christmas treats for Soldier On. Dana delivered filled stockings, a beautiful handmade scarf and gift card, along with several puzzles.

Dana introduced our speaker Jennifer Hamilton, whose topic was "The F-word, Feminism"

Jennifer is a Professor of Legal Studies and Anthropology at Hampshire College and visiting Professor of Sexuality, Women's & Gender Studies at Amherst College.

"Feminism" is both controversial and challenging, even today. In an interactive session with members, Jennifer covered different perspectives about power and inequality, how the pandemic has shed a spotlight on sexual stereotypes about societal roles, the importance of men and women to work together to achieve equality, and for women to mentor other women on the freedom to choose their path and fight injustices. Ruth Bader Ginsberg noted that Equality is not sameness. Equality is understanding difference – gender and racial differences. To have equality you need to recognize and accommodate those differences.

We would love to have Jennifer (and perhaps some of her students) back to continue the discussion.

Following the Program, the business meeting was called to order at about 6:45 by President Dana Burton

November Minutes: A motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes published in the Bog. The vote was in favor.

Treasurers Report: Andrea shared her report by email. A motion was made and seconded to file the report for audit. The vote was in favor.

Joanne Turner-Chiacchia discussed her role as Vice Treasurer. A few years ago, we applied to the IRS for a federal status 501(c)3 public charity and were approved. Donations to the club can be tax-deductible as permitted by law. We have to complete a couple of reports annually to maintain that status. This past spring, Joanne began the process to get us recognized on a state level by the Attorney General's Public Charity Division. This has proven to be a lot more work than anticipated, partly because of the pandemic's impact on staff availability. We need to keep Joanne as the point person until we get a stamp of approval on our status from the state. Joanne also raised the issue that the annual reports that will be needed to maintain our pubic charity status with the state are more cumbersome and may require that we hire an accountant to assist in this effort.

Committee Reports

Poinsettia Fundraiser – Liz reported that we have met or exceeded last year's profit on poinsettia sales. Specific numbers will be available in next month's Treasurer's Report. Thanks to all member who made this fundraiser a success – spreading the word, buying plants, wrapping, delivering, tracking, accounting, etc.! Well done! Education Scholarships –Maria has reached out to area high schools about the YWPA application being available. We also got a news release out to local papers and on our website. Please help pass the word.

Future Meetings

January – We would love to get a speaker tied to the Amelia Earhart theme. Karen will check with her niece for ideas.

February – We can't have our typical Period Project meeting, but there is a strong need for products and awareness during these difficult times.

Getting great speakers and projects that we can use to engage members and the pubic will be critical during the next several months. Dana will send out an email to all members to get us brainstorming.

Dana thanked everyone for attending. Next Newsletter deadline is 12/27; next meeting 1/11/2021.


