Applications Being Accepted for Two Scholarships

Western MA ~ The Zonta Club of Quaboag Valley is now accepting applications for two local awards, with the possibility of winning District and International honors as well.



The 2021 Young Women in Public Affairs (YWPA) Award, recognizes young women for their demonstrat-

ed leadership skills and commitment to public service. Scholarship Chair, Maria Maloney, of Monson, MA notes: "We are looking for women in the Quaboag Valley and surrounding towns who are high school juniors or seniors, and have an active commitment to volunteerism, experience in local or student government, demonstrated leadership skills, and dedication to advancing the status of women throughout the world. The club offers an award of \$1,000 cash to the most outstanding applicant." **Completed applications are due by March 12th.**

The 2021 Jane M. Klausman Women in Business (JMK) Scholarship is open to women in Western MA enrolled in at least the second year of an undergraduate program through the final year of a Master's program in business, leading to a business management career. The program is designed to encourage women to enter careers and to seek leadership positions in business-related fields in their communities and throughout the world. The club offers a \$1000 scholarship to the most outstanding Klausman applicant. Completed applications are due by May 15th.

For both leadership awards, the local winner's application will then be submitted for competition at the Zonta District 1 level (New England states of the U.S. and Nova Scotia, Canada). The District 1 winner goes on to compete internationally, funded by the Zonta International Foundation for Women.

The Notorious RBG



The Zonta Club of Quaboag Valley will celebrate women's achievement on March 11th by learning more about Ruth Bader Ginsburg—a woman who raised awareness against bias and took action for equality. Please invite friends and family to come join us for a lively discussion on the American justice system, feminism, family, and the remarkable legacy of the great dissenter.

Ruth Bader Ginsburg: A Reading List: https://libguides.wlu.edu/law/RBG (rev. 9/24/20) Highlights of texts written by and about Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg of the U.S. Supreme Court; information and video on the nomination and confirmation of Justice Ginsburg, some of her most notable opinions and dis-

sents authored as a justice, and several of the cases she argued before the Supreme Court as an attorney.

Discussion Questions for you to think about:

- Kathleen Peratis recalls her boss RBG telling her of the Supreme Court, "Don't ask them to go too far too fast, or you'll lose what you might have won". Is this statement relevant to our work in our communities and country in advancing the status of women and girls? Are there certain situations, like advocating against child marriage, where it is more or less relevant? RBG firmly believed that for women to be equal, men had to be free. During a dinner party, she interrupted another guest who mentioned that RBG worked on behalf of 'women's liberation.' She turned on him and said, "It is not women's liberation; it is women's and men's liberation." *Notorious RBG p 72* Is this declaration relevant to Zonta's mission? Why/why not?
- RBG believed that "women belong in all places where decisions are being made." Back when many feminists were arguing that women spoke in a different voice, RBG observed the flaw in describing women as inherently different or even purer than men: "To stay uncorrupted, the argument goes, women must avoid internalizing 'establishment' values; they must not capitalize on opportunity presented by an illegitimate opportunity structure." What do you think? How can the ideas proposed be used to advocate on behalf of women and girls?
- Fellow attorney Marcia Greengberger says that "RBG was never in it to be the only one, to be the superstar that nobody could match." RBG mentored legions of feminist lawyers and happily welcomed Sotomayor and Kagan to the Supreme Court. In your experience, have you seen more women helping women or the reverse? Do you think more women are supportive of others in this day and age?

In case you are in need of a beverage during our discussion, here are a couple of suggestions:

THE RUTH BADER GINGER COCKTAIL ~ FOR ONE OR TWO 4-6 ice cubes 3 ounces dark rum 1 ounce ginger liqueur or brandy 2 teaspoons orange juice 2-3 pinches ground cardamom 2 slices of orange 2 mint leaves, slightly crushed

Place 2-3 ice cubes in each of 2 glasses. Place the rum, brandy, orange juice and cardamom in a cocktail shaker or glass jar. Shake vigorously and pour equal amounts in the two glasses. Twist the orange slices slightly to extract a few drops more of orange juice into the liquid, then place the slice on the rim of the each glass. Place one slightly crushed mint leaf in each glass, stir and serve.

GINGER-ORANGE MOCKTAIL ~ FOR A CROWD

5 cups freshly squeezed orange or satsuma juice (from 7 oranges), plus orange slices for serving 3 cups pineapple juice, chilled 1/2 teaspoon orange bitters, such as Angostura 3 (12-oz.) bottles ginger beer, chilled

Combine orange juice, pineapple juice and bitters in a pitcher or punch bowl. Top with ginger beer. Serve over ice. Garnish with orange slices.


