Zonta at the Table with the United Nations and a Peak at Life in Exile as Seen Through the Eyes of Women and Children

REGIONAL— Violence against women and girls has long been one of the most widespread violations of human rights. It knows no national or cultural barriers; it takes place at home, in the workplace, and in open spaces, and affects millions of women and girls in peacetime and conflict. Elizabeth Hart ~ Liz is the Founder and Executive Director of Tailored for Success, a nonprofit organization dedicated to empowering job seekers in transition, and the host of the podcast Pivot Point – Success is a Journey. She has been a member of the Zonta Club of Malden since 2002 and has held many leadership positions in her club and at the District level – representing all of New England USA and Nova Scotia, CA – including past District Governor and current United Nations Chair.

Nina Nedrebo ~ A graduate of Mount Holyoke College (2010), Nina interviewed women refugees from Western Sahara in the Algerian desert on their spoken history, including their Bedouin roots, displacement, and hopes for a resolution to the conflict. She later recorded Sahrawi children's testimonies for the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) of Algeria and the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) of Norway. Now, as an upper elementary school math teacher at Holyoke Public Schools through Teach for America, she loves sharing in the wonder and joy of learning with the children of Holyoke. She holds an MBA (honors) from the University of St. Thomas (2020) in Minnesota and is an M.Ed. candidate at Boston University.

Chris and Karen, Acting Presidents, welcomed everyone on this stormy night. A remembrance message was read in recognition of the 22nd anniversary of 9/11, followed by a moment of silence. We recited the Blessing and paused for dinner of sandwiches and salads.



Scholarship Chair Dana Burton introduced our 2023 Woman in STEM scholarship winner – Cadence Loven – and presented her with a check for \$1000, certificate and a yellow rose. Cadence shared that she is in an undergraduate degree program in Civil Engineering at the University of Massachusetts and plans for graduate school She has an interest in site planning, septic design, soil evaluation and percolation testing. These services are necessary for developing housing and public spaces for communities. They are also vital to completing projects with care for our environment. She believes that the conscientiousness that she carries through all of her work and hobbies will prepare her to do the job well as she enters the workforce.

During her first two college years at Holyoke Community College, Cadence was a student ambassador for the campus ambassador and mentorship program, was named a STEM scholar in the national science foundation program, and was able to gain practical hands-on experience in her desired field through working with her fa-

ther's construction company. Cadence is interested in keeping in touch and we wish her well.

Goal Setting Exercise - what do we want to be celebrating at our June 2024 year-end meeting?

Mary Knight asked members to identify goals we would like to accomplish in four areas this Zonta year. We want input also from members who were unable to attend this meeting, but we have a good start:

We will increase visibility in our communities and membership interest with:

- Awesome speakers on timely topics publicized in local media, social media, through our network of like-minded organizations, and by word of mouth – in October, November, January, February, April and May. We got some ideas tonight, but all members are encouraged to forward the contact info for additional suggested speakers to Chris and Karen. We will try to fill the calendar far enough in advance to get promotional materials out.
- Zonta Says NO! Action as a club during November Pam, could your committee review ideas at zontausa.org/resource library/ toolkits, such as <u>https://zontausa.org/what-we-do/zonta-says-no/safety-signal-for-domestic-violence/</u> If we can outline a plan for the October meeting we will have time to get promotional materials out.
- International Women's Day event dinner to celebrate amazing women from 3-4 different organizations. We need suggested honorees by January to get things rolling for the March event. Keep your eyes and ears open for deserving individuals.

We will make the club stronger by making membership meaningful and fun by:

- Showing the Zonta spirit in our interactions with each other especially at the December and June meetings
- Honoring the international aspect of Zonta by sharing inspiring stories of a Project(s) at one of the meetings and in article(s)
- Making a club donation of 1/3 of profits raised in 2022 to the Foundation for Women at Fall Conference and asking Every Member to give a personal donation – whatever they can - in November. We will then advertise what we have done in the media.

We will focus on sustainability – using everyone's time wisely to avoid burnout by:

- Ensuring newer members attend an orientation and are mentored, so they feel connected, included and are growing.
- Encouraging every member to have an answer to "What is Zonta?" and look out for opportunities for tabling and inviting individuals to learn about Zonta's unique position.
- Not discussed as a group but Mary will be asking each member to review leadership modules created by ZI and the District, pick one to participate in and report back on its usefulness.

We will engage with like-minded individuals and organizations to raise awareness and gain supporters by

 Involving others in hands-on projects. The Keough-Huffs will look at Girl Scouts' Heidi Gutekenst to see if we can work on a climate related project, Joanne will look at Girls, Inc.; the club will also continue the Period Project in February and get additional

- Exploring ways to get our scholarship opportunities more widely seen online scholarship sites, feedback from past recipients of
 education awards, etc. We hope to get at least 2 applications for each of the three scholarships we have budgeted for in 2024
 and beyond

Chris and Karen Keough-Huff called the business meeting to order at about 7:10pm.

Minutes from June 2023: A motion was made, seconded and voted to accept the minutes published in the September Zonta Bog. **Treasurer's Report:** A motion was made and seconded to file the August report for audit.

Fall Conference decisions

- We have a number of individuals who plan on attending Fall Conference in person or on Zoom. All were reminded to register ASAP.
- Members were reminded that Ballot items for District voting are listed at <u>2023fc.zontadistrict1.org/voting</u>. We will take some time
 at the October meeting to review; all are also invited to attend a briefing on 10/23 on Zoom to meet the candidates and ask questions about the proposals.
- Voting will take place online from 10/23-25. Karen volunteered to be the club delegate; Dana will be the alternate. Mary will complete the delegate forms, get signatures and submit as directed by the due date.
- A motion was made and seconded to purchase a \$100 gift card with Service Funds for the Conference online Raffle; proceeds to go to District 1. The vote was in the affirmative. Mary will complete the appropriate form and submit as directed by the due date. The purchase doesn't need to be made until a winner is identified after 10/28.
- A motion was made and seconded to purchase 50 bottles of shampoo for the Fill a Purse service project being held during the fall conference. The vote was in the affirmative. We will order this product on Amazon and have it shipped directly to Halifax.
- As we did not lose any Zonta sisters, the memorial service form will be returned with a N/A.
- Susan will notify the District Treasurer that we have funds set aside for past District Governor gift which will be presented at Conference to Beatrice Schori.

Committee Reports

Membership – Mary announced that all newer members (and anyone else interested) are invited to RSVP for an Orientation meeting on 9/27 @ 6pm. All members are also encouraged to get their elevator speech written and practiced!

CALENDAR ~ The Zonta Club of Quaboag Valley has set its goals for the 2023-2024 fiscal year: visibility, membership engagement, sustainability and growth, and outlined programs and activities to help achieve those aspirations.

In September the club held a successful golf tournament fundraiser (9/9). Profits were added to the club"s Service Fund, 1/3 of which is earmarked for the Zonta Foundation for Women and 2/3 used for Service Grants, scholarships, and projects benefitting women and girls in our communities. At its 9/11 business meeting the club honored Cadence Loven with its Women in STEM Scholarship Award.

On October 9th, the club will welcome two speakers at a 6 p.m. Zoom meeting*. In honor of United Nations month, Past District Governor Elizabeth Hart, Zonta District 1's UN Chair, will explain how Zonta works in consultative status with the UN in building a better world for women and girls. We will then hear from Nina Nedrebo (Mt. Holyoke graduate and current teacher in Holyoke) about Western Sahara, Africa's last colony where conflict has festered for decades, and the women she interviewed in Saharawi refugee camps.

The biannual District 1 Fall Conference will take place in Halifax, Nova Scotia on October 27-29 in hybrid format. It will be proceeded on 10/23 with a Zoom meeting introducing the slate of officers for 2024-2026 and proposals submitted by the District Board. On November 13th we meet at the Ludlow Country Club* to hear key findings from the Women's Fund of Western MA's latest report on Gender Equity in Western Massachusetts: The Status of Women, Girls, Transgender, Nonbinary, and Gender-Diverse Adults and Youth, from Amihan Jennifer Matias, Sr. Director of Community Partnerships, and Sarah Monson, Senior Director of Philanthropy. The extensive data synthesized in this report tell a story of both positive change and ongoing injustice. Although numerous gender inequities in Western Massachusetts continue to exist, there has been progress.

Also in November, a campaign known as Zonta Says No! coincides with the 16 Days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence - **November 25th - December 10**. Advocacy Chair Pam Albertson and her committee have plans underway to raise awareness. And, in honor of Zonta's birthday (11/8/1919) is the Every Member, Every November fundraising effort, where all Zontians give whatever they can to the Foundation for Women.

Please be on the lookout also for our Poinsettia fundraiser. You won't find a more beautiful plant to brighten the holidays.

December is all about Zonta Spirit and fun! We will meet on 12/11 at the Keough-Huff home in Belchertown for a holiday potluck,* board games, and music. We are collecting ideas for anyone interested in holiday giving to kids.

January is Amelia Earhart month and we are delighted to welcome Grace Gerhardt, an Aerospace Engineer graduate who works as a manager at Pratt & Whitney in a mostly male-dominated department. Like Amelia, Grace has learned to overcome adversity and show a tenacious spirit. We will meet at the Ludlow Country Club on January 8th *

On February 12th, at the Ludlow Country Club,* Andrea Bordenca, founder and community engagement organizer of Lead Yourself Youth, will facilitate a panel discussion on foster children who are falling through the cracks and why we should care. We will also collect some dignity for this population and for survivors of abuse and homelessness: feminine and hygiene items and products for African-American hair types.

March 11th at the Ludlow Country Club we celebrate Women Making a Difference in honor of International Women's Day.* The club is seeking nominations of Women leaders in the community and non-profit organizations deserving of recognition.

On April 8th at the Ludlow Country Club, we celebrate women's health with an awareness campaign*. Details to come from Kerry Chenausky.
