In support of the mission of Zonta International to build a better world for women and girls, the Zonta Club of Quaboag Valley has worked on numerous initiatives in its 33 year history. Some of the projects include mentoring women veterans who are rebuilding their lives at the Soldier On Program in Leeds; collecting and filling handbags with personal items needed by women living in

shelters and on the streets; donating hundreds of toys and books to local nonprofits for distribution to children who may not otherwise receive personal gifts; and partnering with like-minded local non-profits to empower women and youth to push aside barriers on the path to achieving their full potential.

Two-thirds of the profits from these events support our local service projects and scholarship awards: one-third is donated to the Zonta Foundation for Women which supports projects and programs around the world.

Panelist: Lashanda Stone, MSW has been with the Department of Children and Families over 24 years in a number of roles—currently as coordinator for the Volunteer Foster Case Review Program. This Unit makes decisions regarding children who are placed in foster care for six months or longer, assessing how well their needs are being met and what progress has been made toward establishing them in a permanent living situation. A Volunteer from the Community is one member of the 3-person panels that make these decisions. The need for the communities' engagement in helping the Department make decisions on behalf of children in care is ever-present.
