

Our main speaker tonight was **Alison Berman, Council Director for Girls on the Run Western MA.** During her presentation of slides and a video, Alison shared statistics and evidence-based strategies that empower girls – ages 8-13 – to recognize their inner strength, boost heir physical activity and envision boundless possibilities.

GOTR claims to make a stronger impact than organized sports and physicaleducation programs in teaching life skills such as managing emotions, resolving conflict, helping others, and making intentional decisions. There are separate curricula for grades 3-5 and 6-8, so the lessons are age-appropriate. And the girls keep journals to track their personal goals and progress.



Because of her leadership, Alison has been named a 2024 Women of Impact Honoree by BusinessWest and will be celebrated with other deserving women at an event on December 5, 2024 at the Sheraton Springfield Monarch Place Hotel.

Girls on the Run seeks Coaches and Volunteers – see the posters and registration information for details. This is a great opportunity for hands-on activity that could directly impact on the life of a young girl. There is something for everyone – whatever availability you might have. Report on the 16 Days of Activism Karen Keough-Huff, Advocacy Chair

Zonta Says NO! and the International effort to raise awareness about gender-based violence—The 16 Days of Activism— begins November 25 and will conclude on December 10 – the same day the Universal Declaration of Human rights was adopted by the UN General Assembly in 1948. This declaration proclaims the inalienable rights which everyone is entitled to as a human being regardless of race, color, religion, sex, language, political or other opinion, national or social origin, property, birth or other status.

This year for our Advocacy project, volunteer contributors will be submitting a poem or short story about women with the following themes: **Empowerment, Survival, Resilience, and Mother SHero's**. Each day, beginning November 25, a poem/story will be posted on our Zonta Club of Quaboag Valley website, on an email blast and on Facebook.

Women are increasingly impacted by gender-based violence, health-care gaslighting, climate change and economic imbalance—and more. Our hope is that our personal writings will raise awareness and inspire others to address these issues in their communities. Members of the club and supporters are asked to find photos or drawings we can use with permission to accompany the poems and stories. We also need members to share the emails and postings with friends and family and ask them to do the same.
