A positive youth development organization serving Hampden County girls and young women ages 5-18, Girls Inc. provides hands-on programs that focus on long-term academic/literacy support and enrichment, social emotional skill-building, college and career readiness, and leadership training to empower youth and prepare them for successful futures. The Zonta Club of Quaboag Valley partners with nonprofits serving women and youth from Sturbridge to Westfield and has contributed over \$150 thousand in cash and in-kind donations in the area since its inception in 1991. The club raises fund for Service Grants by sponsoring an annual Golf Tournament in September, selling Poinsettia plants in November and doing a calendar drive in the spring.
